

Survey to PCC Faculty Fall 2012

In accordance with AB 1725 regarding Shared Governance, PCC's Academic Senate defines "consult collegially" to mean that the "district governing board shall develop policies on academic and professional matters" by relying "primarily upon the advice and judgment of the Academic Senate."

Whereas the District has violated Shared Governance by

- unilaterally cancelling Winter 2013 intersession while disregarding PCCs process of shared governance (including the Academic Senate's passage of the current calendar that maintains Winter intersession)
- unilaterally imposing the new calendar for the remainder of 2012-2013 while disregarding the decision made by the Calendar Committee and the PCC College Council, both made up of all constituent groups – faculty, staff and students
- unilaterally cancelling Winter 2013 intersession and imposing a trimester calendar in violation of legal contractual obligations with the PCC Faculty Association
- realigning the college while disregarding PCCs shared governance and the decision made by the Reorganization Realignment Committees in which dozens of faculty spent months assessing all options

Whereas on August 27, 2012, the President told Academic Senate leadership that no Board action would be taken on a new calendar until full collegial discussions – however on August 29, the new calendar was present to the Board by the President and passed,

Whereas on September 10, 2011 the President told the Board of Trustees "although consultations occurs with the key leaders and constituent groups, these leaders/groups may make recommendations, but they are not asked to approve decisions. The Superintendent/President approves the item to be brought before the Board for review" (as printed in the Annual Board Retreat Meeting Notes)

Whereas the President falsely stated at the August 2012 Board of Trustee meeting that the Calendar Committee proposed and supported the trimester calendar,

Whereas during recent FA/District negotiations meetings, the President falsely claimed the "shared governance process is broken" at the college,

Whereas the District has refused to acknowledge the Associated Students and other student groups who have emphatically supported the maintenance of the current calendar,

Whereas the District violated the Brown Act in not admitting students, faculty, and community members to Board of Trustees meetings, and in refusing to allow full public commentary,

Whereas the District has admitted it is not in a financial crisis in its official documentation to the state, yet it has increased its reserves (from 14% to over 20%) while cutting over 1000 classes in the past four years,
